Ash Wednesday Mass is at 9am on February 14th. Blessing with Ashes at 6pm-no Mass.

This is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

When fasting, you are permitted to eat one full meal as well as two smaller portions that together are not equal to a full meal. This is for those 18- through 59-years of age.

Abstaining from meat is from age 14 onwards.

Bring your old palms before Ash Wednesday to be turned into ashes—boxes in narthex and hall.

LOVE FOR LENT by Dr. Scott Hahn February 2024 Breaking the Bread Newsletter



I've said it before, and I'll say it again: Catholics love Lent.

Yes, we grumble about it. We tell the world how much we miss the chocolate or beer or whatever it is we're giving up. But the complaints are just part of the experience. We wouldn't trade this season for the world.

Just watch the people pour from the back of the church into long lines as they go forward for ashes. Just watch them defiantly wear their ashes to work or school. Watch them line up again on Friday in the parish cafeteria and inch forward for an hour to buy a meal of fish and French fries. They could buy the same platter any day of the week at any bar in town. But they choose to go to church for their days of abstinence from meat.

Lent poses a challenge, and Catholics-deep downwant a challenge. Lent marks us with a strong identity, and we want that, too. Between the ashes and Easter, we can grow together in virtue and in our understanding of the Church's rich biblical spirituality.

Shrine Corner

In 1953, the Diocese of Saginaw gave permission to build a chapel within the Shrine to celebrate outdoor Mass. The chapel was placed in the left wing of the grotto and I could see in a 1960 video where benches were placed in front of the altar for the congregation to attend Mass.

However, with the advent of Vatican II, whereby the priest now faces the congregation, this altar is no longer being used. Furthermore, the congregation would sit in the open with no shade which was very uncomfortable on a hot day.

This past Christmas season a beautiful setting for the Nativity was placed within the altar. Ironically, early Christian Art depicts Nativity scenes in these cave type structures.



The five steps on the right of the altar leading up to the Bernadette Fountain represent the five decades of the

rosary. They also remind of the five continents (as learned in some parts of the world) that the entire world will walk, live humbly and justly before God. The five continents are Africa, Asia, Europe, Antarctica and the Americas.

We now have \$32.800.18 towards next year's projects.
