



Patient Attention: For many people, the coronavirus pandemic has been a test of patience — or worse. Medically vulnerable people face an anxious time of hypervigilance. Furloughed workers wait to go back to work, or in lines for assistance. Special events have been canceled or rescheduled. Businesses closed...many forever. Those not impacted directly still have to deal with assorted frustrations and inconveniences. Many people are learning the benefit of slowing down, being present (even virtually) to others and practicing patient attention. Interestingly, scientist Isaac Newton did some of his best work when the plague forced Cambridge University to close. Later he called 1666 it his "year of wonders" and reportedly said, "If I have made any valuable discoveries, it owes more to patient attention than to any other talent."
