The summer is heating up and so is the tour activity at Our Lady of the Woods Shrine.

Last time I checked, we have exceeded the number of tours taken this year over what was taken last year at this time. As of this week, we have had 11 tours at the Shrine and have another 4 scheduled to occur by the end of October 5th. This does not include other tours that are projected, primarily from the Chaldean contingent in September of 2024.

The awareness of our local Marian shrine is expanding into many other geographical areas and to many who have different religious beliefs. We have made a concerted effort to increase our patronage from the west side of the state as two tours are from the Grand Rapids area.

Also, we are now on the tour schedule of other groups which may not have a Catholic nor Christian association. For example, Thunder Bay Resort now includes Our Lady of the Woods Shrine as one of their stops on their Elk viewing tours.

They have brought folks in from other states: Pennsylvania, Maryland and Delaware. Recently, the "Polish Hillbillies Travel Company" out of Linwood, Michigan has included our Shrine as a stop on one of their tours in July. As Father San told me – All are Welcome.

Please note that the visitors to date all love our Shrine even though we are going under a considerable restoration process.
