



#### **Shrine Corner**

St. Mary is the best church I have ever attended. No matter what the request, people just step up and come forward. When money is requested for any reason, our gracious family members and visitors make donations.

When you think of the CSA amount that had to be raised and the Restoration also trying to raise \$87,000 to pay for this year's work, the Parish Family and Friends continue to rise to the occasion. When we wanted an outdoor platform and altar, a person comes forward and donates the money and people donate their time to build it. When we wanted railings for the outdoor altar, we had a person who made them. When we had stained glass windows broken in the Shrine, we had a person step forward and now they are in place. When we wanted a Kiosk for the Shrine, we had a person who made it. It does not stop there.

Last Saturday, we had the second annual 5K walk/run. The weather was ideal—sunny and cool. The bugs stayed home. 28 participants took to the course and through donations, raised \$4,975.00 for the Restoration. This amount will be applied to the \$7,000.00 June Match Donation which brings us to \$6,909.31.

One other additional fact about the 5K. We had a couple of Chaldeans who were visiting the Shrine and participated. When done, she said to tell her the date for next year and she will get more participants. Our Blessed Mother has a way of helping us DAILY! THANK YOU TO ALL WHO PARTICIPATED AND CONTRIBUTED. This is truly the greatest Parish Family!

One last item. I mentioned above somebody made the stained glass windows. I would be in trouble if I mentioned her name, but I do want to mention RICHARD TROYER who figured out a way to make a frame and had the glass inserted. The windows are now placed back in the Shrine. These windows are in the old altar area and can be seen from the inside and outside over the big flower garden. Maybe Richard can put the MARY mosaic back on the wall in the Pieta. THANK YOU!!!!
