### **SHRINE CORNER**

Prioritize, prioritize... recently a parishioner commented that it appeared we were failing to prioritize activities and perhaps we needed to refocus. A valid comment, anyone with a big project breaks it into smaller ones and prioritizes based on resources required, time to complete and immediacy of need. Have we lost our focus? Are we being distracted by smaller projects? Having achieved our target of 100K for this year's work and the weather bringing activities to a close, now is the time to reprioritize.

During initial Shrine Restoration Committee meetings (in 2014), calls were made, experts brought in, presentations made, and cost estimates presented. Based on costs, "restoration" not "renovation" was agreed upon. Secondary structures were to be addressed following completion of the main structure. Committee members were determined that the Parish not go into debt completing the Restoration. The decision was made and presented to the Bishop that work would be completed as funding was acquired. Delays could occur as we worked to reach funding targets.

The Adopt-a-Statue program was developed for donors who desired to donate to a specific purpose. Work would occur when sufficient statues were adopted to bring in a contractor. Coming out of the pandemic restrictions, the program was a way to continue activities onsite, when it was unclear what form future fundraising would take, or if we would reach our funding target for work on the front of the Shrine. Ongoing work has shown to generate donations. Unfortunately they were booked

Concurrent with Shrine Restoration activities have been small projects to improve the grounds for visitors and to further make it a place of prayer. Have we lost our focus? We welcome your comments and thank you for your generosity.
