





We are very blessed to have the Knights of Columbus bring to our parish the Silver Rose on Mother's Day weekend— May 11th and May 12th.



The Silver Rose honors Our Lady of Guadalupe. She was so beneficial to the people of Mexico that, in 1960, the Columbian Squires, a youth organization of the Knights of Columbus wanted to give something back.

They decided to run a rose to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico to celebrate Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses. This is where Juan

We now have \$42,262.60 towards this year's project—the ponds, the waterfalls, and the application of a sealant to the entire structure.

opened his tilma filled with castellan roses before the bishop and his attendants and hat an image of Our Lady of Guadalupe was imprinted on the tilma.

Initially, the rose traveled through the United States and Canada finishing up at the Basilica in Mexico. After a year, however, the rose had decayed, so a group decided to make a bronze rose. When the Columbian Squires heard this, they decided to make a silver rose because it was the precious metal of Mexico.
