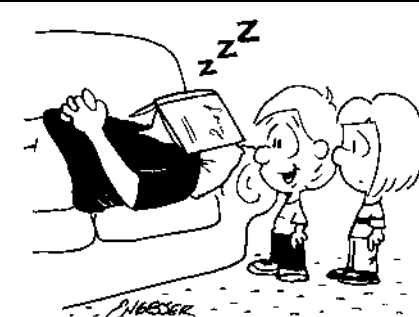
Shrine Corner.
