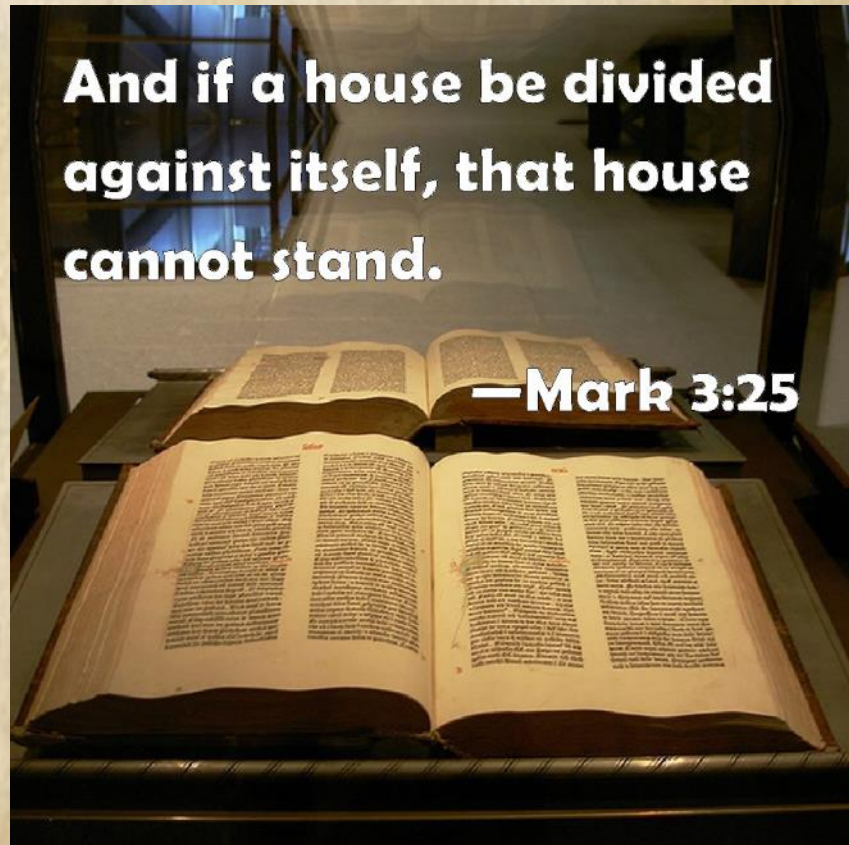

Shrine Corner

Monte has asked me to do a couple of the Shine Corners and there has been some dramatic changes for the better around the Shrine.

I took a walk around and saw FLOWERS, FLOWERS, FLOWERS everywhere. I cannot say enough about how beautiful the Shrine looks with the flowers. A visitor cannot help but notice the beauty of the Shrine. Our Blessed Mother must be extremely happy. The ladies involved in preparing each bed need to be put on a pedestal. The flowers are colorful & beautiful, more so than ever before in my time here. Visitors have often told me they come to see the beautiful gardens—wait till they come this year. Beautiful job, LADIES.

In late May the Parish volunteers were asked to step forward in the kitchen as Tours and two funerals occurred in a very short time. Once again, the parish family rose to the occasion and responded pulling off all these events in a magnificent fashion. Many of our new parishioners were involved and did a tremendous job. I was not here for all the events so I am not going to name names, but the reviews were super. Thank you!

Outdoor Mass started on Memorial Day weekend. The Mass was celebrated before a very large group of family and visitors. The platform and the altar are beautiful additions to an already beautiful Shrine. I won't name names here, either, but another beautiful job. I can't wait until the finishing piece to the altar arrives and is put in place. Thank you, MEN!

At the Shrine we see a crane again—this time to spray the preservative that will be a water repellent. Once the spray is applied to the front and back, the crane will disappear. I see Meridian employees are working on the ponds and looks they are well on their way to finishing that task. Once they get the stonework done, they will apply some sort of substance to the base to hold the water in the ponds and eliminate leakage. Personally, I will be glad when the water can flow as designed. It adds so much to the front side.

I want to say thank you to Scott Dzienis for making the technology advancement of audio tours to the Shrine. This has been something we have wanted for years and, thanks to Scott, it is in place.
