The Annual Parish Financial Report for the previous fiscal year of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 is now available in the narthex.


Server Schedules for September and October are available in the narthex.

SHRINE CORNER

The restoration received donations totaling \$4,369.09. The Restoration Account totals \$89,591.35.

Another Feast of the Assumption has come and gone. Dan Thorpe and Father San did an excellent job of orchestrating the activity for the day, and it was executed perfectly. It all started with Saturday setup. Dan and his trusty band of Saturday workers included Richard Troyer, Dave Lashley, Nick Lashley, Kevin Grace, Father San and there were more. Folks, if you never worked the Assumption you don't know how much planning and work go into the day, both before and during. I am estimating 40 or more walked around the Shrine for the Rosary that was led by Joe Gibala. Flowers provided by Sharon LeBlanc were placed at all five Marian apparitions. More people arrived for Stations led by Joe G and assisted by K of C members. 150 chairs had been set up for Mass and more had to be brought out as the crowd grew. Dan thought more chairs might be needed so K of C members went to a hidden location and easily pulled out more chairs which now totaled 200. Nobody did an exact count but over 200 people came to Mary's Mass. The choir of Michelle and Ben Horger, Tena Troyer, Delores McArdle, Ellen Sherwood and Don Owczarzak led the music. Before Mass, Don O. opened with Immaculate Mary and was followed by Michelle Horger with Ave Maria. Father San celebrated Mass to a full "crowd"—something he wishes for and mentions often in his homilies. After Mass the people flowed into the Parish Hall and quickly went through the prepared meals and more had to be made. Ann Galbraith led the kitchen workers of Sharon LeBlanc, Annette Graham and Marianne Roddy. They worked diligently in the kitchen and nobody went away hungry. I am not even going to try to name all the volunteers who helped with takedown. Did I mention that the weather was perfect?— no wind, no humidity and no clouds. Folks this was a job of love for Mary, and it was executed perfectly. I enjoy and have been blessed to give tours of the Shrine and have done so for a period of years now. I marvel at what I see from the people who walk the Shrine. Often I experience Divine Intervention during these tours. I witnessed a 94-year-old woman walk the Shrine when her daughter told me she would not be able to do it. The woman was willing, and I held her arm the entire way, and she completed the entire tour. At the end, the daughter said "I can't believe it." On August 10, I had the privilege of setting up a tour for a pilgrimage of 21 women. One woman utilized a cane and had great difficulty making her legs work properly. She had extreme difficulty going up and down the steps. In addition, it was extremely humid and hot. Faith in God is an amazing power that gave this woman the desire and strength to navigate the steps on the front patio and walk the entire tour which included on the grass to St. Francis and finishing back to the hall. In the hall she said "I am tired but happy I saw the Shrine." These are cases where their FAITH was so strong, they were not going to be denied. I am blessed to be able to witness these miracles of FAITH. Folks I say it over and over again that Our Lady of the Woods Shrine is a very special place. As I get older, I use these people's stories for inspiration. God Bless, Jim L.
