

Our Lady of Fatima-Feast Day May 13

Mary appeared to three peasant children near Fatima, Portugal—Lúcia dos Santos, Francisco and Jacinta Marto—six times between May 13 and October 13, 1917.

The children reported a prophecy that prayer would lead to an end to the Great War, and that

on October 13 the Lady would reveal her identity and perform a



miracle "so that all may believe." After some newspapers reported that the Virgin Mary had promised a miracle for the last of her apparitions, a huge crowd, possibly between 30.000 and 100.000. gathered at Cova da Iria. Although not everyone there saw anything happen, many others said that the Sun appeared as an opaque, spinning disc in the sky

that cast multicolored lights across the landscape. This became known as the "Miracle of the Sun".

The children, Francisco and Jacinta Marto later died in a flu pandemic. Francisco Marto died at home on April 4,1919, at the age of ten. Jacinta died at the age of nine in Queen Stephanie's Children's Hospital in Lisbon on February 20,1920.

They are buried at the Sanctuary of Fátima. They were beatified by Pope John Paul II on May 13, 2000 and canonized by Pope Francis on May 13, 2017.

The Bishop of Leiria-Fátima officially declared the visions of Fátima as "worthy of belief" in October 1930, officially permitting the belief of Our Lady of Fátima.

We received donations that totaled \$2.475.00. The total for the Restoration Account is \$45.815.51.

Talked to Jim Supina who met with the representative from the construction company. The representative was asked to evaluate the work and determine bids on how to do the work in three parts. Costs for work done in three parts allows for some work to be accomplished, depending on the availability of money. The bid sections will be for three sections, one section with a crane and the other two without a crane. The crane causes the cost to rise substantially. This will allow for the bids to be reviewed and approved and depending on the money available work will be approved. At this time the bids are not available for this insert.

Saturday outdoor Masses at the Shrine will start June 5 and continue every Saturday until September 4. Masses will be celebrated at 6:00 p.m.

Sharon L. has purchased a booth for Mio HOMETOWN CELE-BRATION DAYS on the Courthouse Grounds. It is my understanding the other booth purchasers will be making a single item donation for a raffle for the Restoration of the Shrine. Once again the Mio people step forward and help.
