



s an ordained minister, (Mister) Fred Rogers harnessed the power of television to tell children they were loved—and to show them how to love others. In *You Are Special*, he wrote, "When we love a person, we accept him or her exactly as is: the lovely with the unlovely, the strong along with the fearful, the true mixed in with the façade. We should also accept ourselves that way."

In a review of the documentary *Won't You Be My Neighbor?* a writer notes: "Mister Rogers' real secret was that the call to love your neighbor as yourself isn't a slogan to hang in your kitchen with flowers around it—it's a decision you make every moment. If you don't act on it, then you're just another person with a kitchen slogan."
