First make sure they are truly usable and in good condition. Please don't give worn out items that no one would want to use. Consider the following locations—and call first!

Lydia's Gate Homeless Shelter – 826-5588 For women and children only, so they would take clothing in 'good' condition. No men's clothes. They also (if they have space) take appliances and furniture. They're given to families who finally have a home to furnish. They may consider nice decorations.

His Love Family Resources – 826-5817 This crisis pregnancy center helps young families in need. They welcome children's clothing (including teens), toys, bedding, and possibly some furniture that a young family might need.

Love INC (In the Name of Christ) – 989-848-2020 Love, INC represents and is supported by many of the churches in our community. A variety of church assistance is available to those who call for help with a need. Love INC may take appliances or furniture in good shape if other resources can't.
